

The purpose is:

- To improve the material base related to the diagnostics of medical institutions of the Chernivtsi oblast and Suceava County hospitals by the end of project implementation.
- To increase the knowledge and practical skills of target groups in strokefight through interactive tools by the end of project implementation.

Project outcomes

1,130,000 people covered by improved health services as a direct consequence of programme support

2 medical service infrastructure units improved

1 E-clinic systems installed

100 participants of training related to modern medical practices,

Reducing the number of people affected by untimely or poor quality of medical care in case of strokes at least by 40%

Decrease the number of newly registered cases of illness caused by the consequences of

bad quality diagnostics in Suceava and Chernivtsi regions by 20%

Decrease of mortality from strokes by 30% after the project implementation

Reducing the premature mortality from stroke consequences by 10% during 5 years after the project implementation

Abt. 24,750 people: in-patient doctors, primary healthcare medics, nurses, paramedics, and social workers from Chernivtsi oblast and of Gura Humorului city have participated to the project activities.
