- **endowment of IES Delta Tulcea** (3 utility terrain vehicles operational in inaccessible areas, 1 water tanker container to feed the fire engines for dry vegetation and forest fires, photography and video recording equipment)
- **endowment of MDSES Odessa** (1 specialized truck, 2 specialized passenger vehicles to monitor the situation in the service area in the Odesa region)
- **1 joint exercise** with 100 officers
