The problem. Project's solution

The Maramureș–Ivano-Frankivsk cross-border area faces growing risks from floods, landslides, and extreme weather caused by climate change, while lacking adequate strategies and resources for disaster response. The project strengthens resilience by promoting cross-border cooperation, training communities, and organizing joint exercises for emergency responders. Through special endowments, awareness campaigns, knowledge exchange, and shared resources, it builds adaptive capacity, improves preparedness, and ensures a safer, more sustainable future for both regions.

Project Outcomes

- **endowment of Viseu de Sus Town** (versatile vehicle offers dual capabilities for snow removal and water tank functions, Unimog with tipper platform and accessories)
- **endowment of Kolomyia City** (Cargo-Passenger Minibus, Radio Stations, IT equipment, specialized equipment for setting up temporary shelters, conducting search and rescue missions, etc)
- **1 common crisis intervention strategy**
- **4 cross-border educational meetings and exchange visits for 120 children** to learn about climate change, ecosystem-based adaptation, and disaster risk prevention
- **3 training sessions** for local communities, government officials, and NGOs on disaster preparedness, response, and recovery strategies
- **2 Joint disaster simulation exercises** conducted on the field with a participation of at least 40 participants.
