The problem. **Project's solution**

The Danube border area between Romania and Ukraine faces frequent floods, vegetation fires, industrial accidents, and limited access during emergencies due to inadequate equipment and difficult terrain. The project tackles these cross-border risks by improving coordination, providing modern intervention boats and underwater drones, and organizing joint firefighter exercises and training. These actions strengthen preparedness, reduce response times, and ensure faster, safer, and more efficient disaster management across the Danube region.
