Cross-border partnership for access to a community-based care system

The problem. Project's solution

The Romanian-Ukrainian border area faces serious healthcare challenges: low life expectancy, underfunded systems, poor access in remote communities, and post-war infrastructure damage in Ukraine. Many residents lack nearby specialized care, especially the elderly and vulnerable groups. The project addresses these issues by investing in local medical infrastructure, enhancing recovery and dental services, and fostering cross-border cooperation. Through joint actions, health education, and improved access, the initiative aims to strengthen public health systems and deliver better care across all three partner communities.

Project Outcomes

- abt. 9,800 persons will benefit annually from the modernised health care facilities
- one medical treatment and recovery center built and endowed in Moftinu Mare village
- rehabilitation and endowment of the outpatient clinic building in Vyshkovo Village
- rehabilitation and endowment of the medical center in Campulung la Tisa Commune
- 6 joint training workshops and meetings for health specialists
- health prevention actions and screening programmes (musculoskeletal disorders and rheumatic diseases, common dental diseases, diabetes, etc)
- 1 campaign to improve the oral health of children
- 1 campaign to promote the importance of physical movement
- 1 minibus for transporting patients with limited mobility
- 1 4x4 passenger car for family doctors
- 3 organisations cooperating across borders
