The Romanian- Ukrainian cross-border medical system faces significant challenges, including outdated infrastructure, insufficient medical equipment, and underfunding, resulting in delays and reduced care quality.

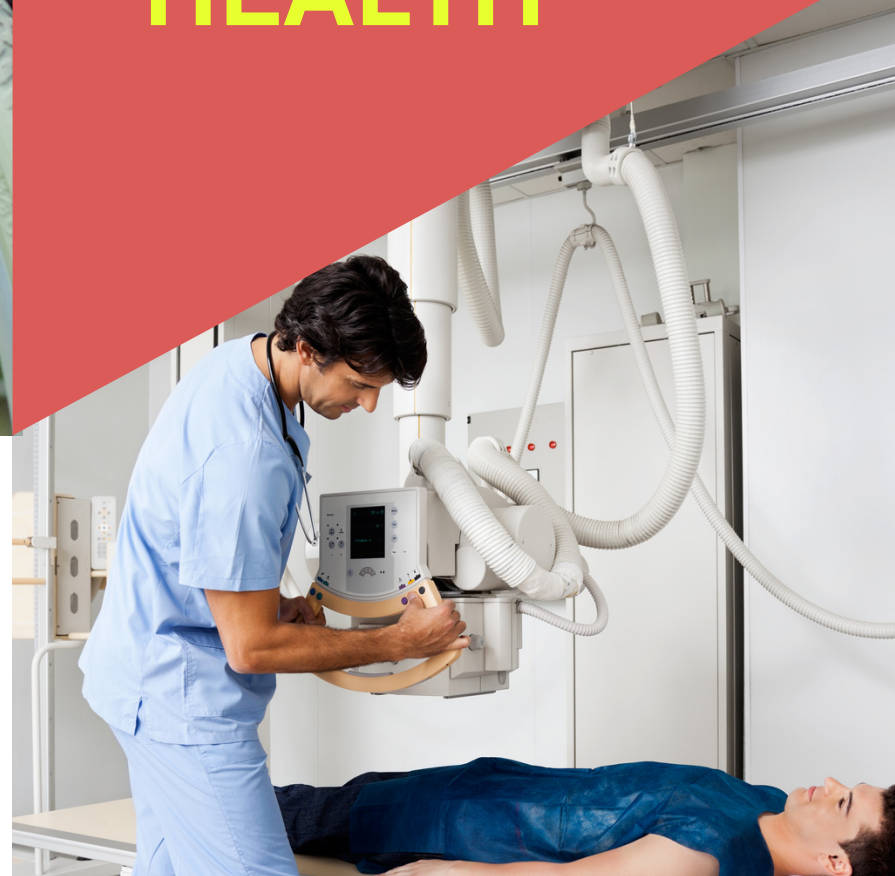

## Project Outcomes

- **abt. 7,500 persons** will benefit annually from the modernised health care facilities
- **2 events Health Days** organised by both partners
- **2 series of First Aid Trainings** for 40 people from Romania and Ukraine
- **endowment of dispensary in Tarna Mare Commune** (automatic defibrillators, portable oxygen devices, surgical aspirators, lymphatic drainage device, a set of equipment for accessibility of disabled people, electricity generator and photovoltaic panels, an elevator, etc.)
- **endowment of dispensary in Korolevo Commune** (mobile X-ray system and stationary ultrasound machine, etc)
- **2 organisations** cooperating across borders
