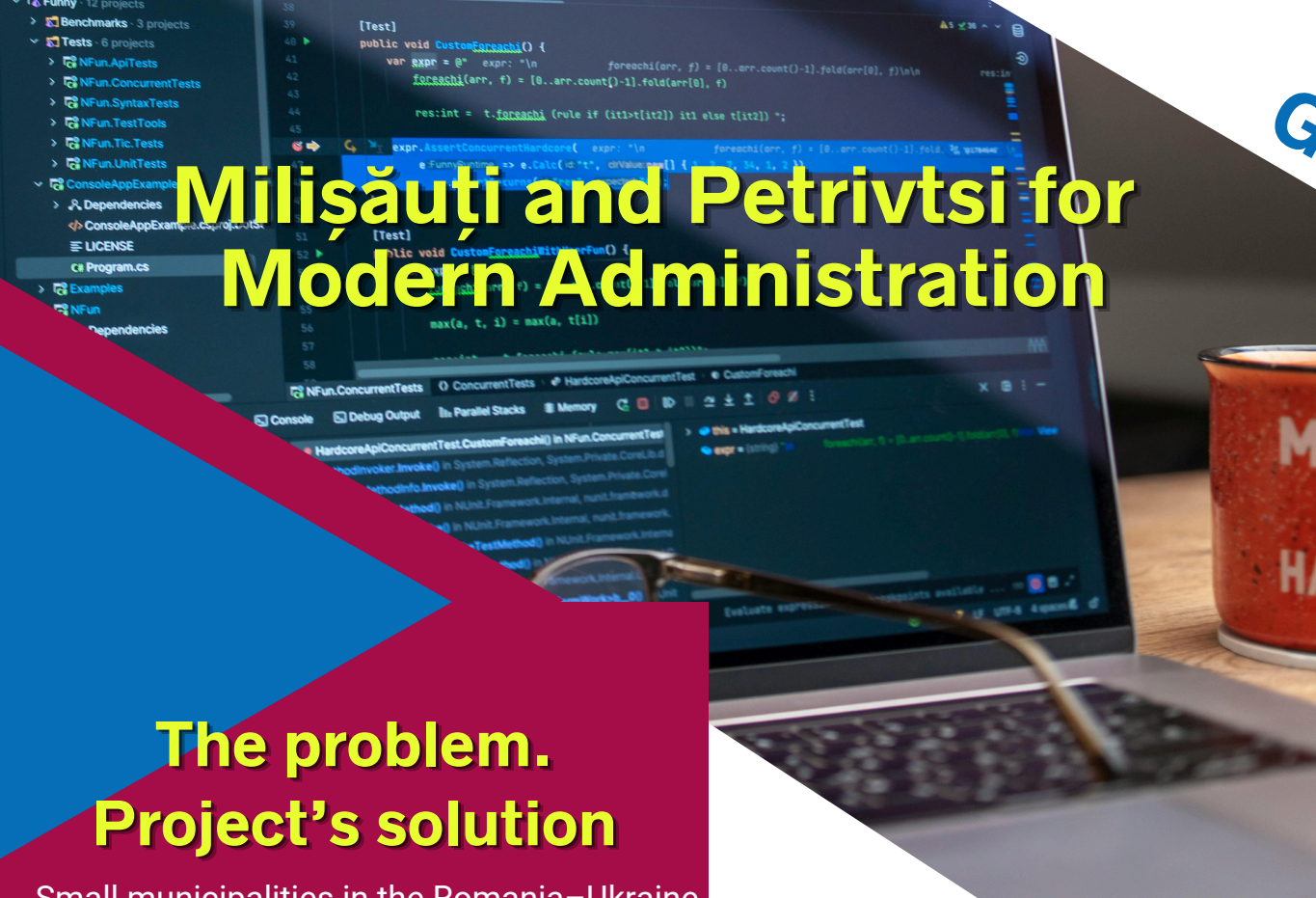

The problem. Project's solution

Small municipalities in the Romania–Ukraine border area face outdated infrastructure, weak digital capacity, limited institutional cooperation, and low citizen engagement, reducing the efficiency and transparency of public services. The project addresses these challenges through coordinated digital modernization, staff training, SDG-based governance practices, joint study visits, and cross-border cooperation between Milișăuți and Petrivtsi to create a sustainable, citizen-oriented, and replicable model of public administration.
